Let Love Be Sincere

⁹Love must be sincere. Hate what is evil; cling to what is good. ¹⁰ Be devoted to one another in love. Honor one another above yourselves. Romans 12:9-10

Dundo is a remote city in Angola, as far North East as you can go before entering into the Democratic Republic of Congo. When Icel, our middle daughter Amanda, and I, lived for one year in Angola (2009-2010), we were never able to travel to Dundo. At the time the roads were impassable, and police were everywhere and heavily armed in order to protect diamond mines. Such a trip would have been all but impossible.

But why would we have wanted to go there in the first place? It was precisely from this most inaccessible place that we had received the largest group of students at the orphanage in Quessua. People from Dundo (Lunda Norte Province) speak a different language than those in Quessua (Malange Province), as they belong to a different ethnic group, the Chokwe nation. Truth be told, we found persons in Malange who were not fond of the presence of Chokwe students among them. A decade earlier, Chokwes and Kimbundos (ethnic group in Malange) were fighting for opposing sides in the Angolan civil war (1975 – 2002). Resentments were still present between the two groups.

However, my family and I found the Chokwes to be fascinating persons. They had spent days on the road before arriving in Quessua, and were all so eager to study. They told us captivating stories about the native traditions they still maintain, the kind that would make you think that you were talking to someone from pre-Colonial Angolan times. Now, these were not frightening stories; these were practices of community support, mentoring of young ones, and life lived in closeness to nature. Eventually, the brightest from this group graduated with honors from the Quesssua High School and went on to pursue university careers, many of them with financial support from the Florida Annual Conference. Young boys who grew up in the bushes are now adult leaders of a great church and nation.

As a surprise that God had in store for us, in 2024 Icel and I were able to visit Dundo as part of a Florida Team. Our dreams finally came true...and reality was even much better than we expected. We found a church in revival, and the most hospitable people you can ever meet. We even received an audience with the acting provincial governor. We witnessed that relationships between Chokwes and Kimbundos have greatly improved. They continue to work together for the good of the Angolan church and nation.

For Christians, "love your neighbors" is not a suggestion but a commandment. "Love must be sincere," i.e., manifest in actions. We cannot show favoritism for the rich or the poor. The apostle Paul calls us to "hate what is evil…and be devoted to one another in love." A little action carried out in love goes a long way. It comes from the heart of God and changes our lives and our neighbors.

As we celebrate love in the month of February, let us remember that we are all created by the same God and in His image. Love ALL your neighbors in concrete and palpable ways.

We also went to Universal's Rock the Universe at the end of January. We took a group of 30 people to enjoy a night of fun, rides and music. There were a total of nine different musical groups that




praised and helped us worship our wonderful Lord. The youth built bonds with friends and welcomed new friends on this trip.


