

### "Draw the Circle"

Rejoice always, pray continually, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus. 1 Thessalonians 5:16-18



Let me begin by quoting an influential author: "I have a confession to make. Even though I wrote a book on prayer, and my personal prayer life was thriving, I had failed to lead our church in corporate prayer. When that changed, everything changed with it." These are the words of Mark Batterson, in the introduction to his book *Draw the Circle: The 40 Day Prayer Challenge*, page 9. Well, I too have a confession to make: I also have failed to lead our congregation at First UMC-PSL into a deeper, *corporate* expression of prayer. We do have many persons who pray in our church, and even small groups, such as Emmaus reunion groups. But as a church we are doing very little corporate prayer, that is, coming together as a congregation with the purpose to intercede

and being in the presence of God for longer periods of time.

As an attempt to change such failure on my part, we will study this book, *Draw the Circle*, by Mark Batterson. I have been asked why change to a book of devotionals instead of a study book for our Lenten small groups. The answer is that this is not only a collection of devotionals. This a deep book that challenges us to our core so that we are more invested in prayer as a church. Consequently, I invite all our small groups to read this book in two ways simultaneously: read it as a daily devotional and also study it in healthy discussions in our small groups. As you read, take note of the ways in which this book asks you to change and grow in your/our prayer life. See which are the ideas that motivate you the most, and also those statements with which you may disagree. Then come to the small groups with your notes and discuss them with all members. Our goal is that in our meetings we will also make some time for prayers.

Sounds like a plan? Please, email or call Pastor Rich or me with any questions or recommendations you might have about the book. My suggestion is that we read 8 devotionals per week so that we can finish the book in 5 weeks (there are a total of 40 devotionals). I will share at least one question per devotional for discussions, but please, bring your own ideas and discussion questions every time you meet in your small group.

In the exhortation above from 1 Thess 5:17, Paul is addressing not an individual but the entire church in Thessalonica. As a matter of fact, all Pauline letters, even those written apparently to individuals (1-2 Timothy and Titus), are actually written to the entire church at the cities addressed. This means that the appeal to dedicate more time to prayer ("pray continually" or "without ceasing") includes coming together as a church to be in communion with God. As another example, remember the group of disciples at the Upper Room in the days leading up to Pentecost: they had gathered together at this place to pray as a group. This is what we need to do more in our church: encourage one

another by weaving together intercessions that intermingle with one another and ascend before the presence of God as one corporate prayer from all the church. May God allow this to be so.





This month has a fifth Sunday on March 30th.






# MISSIONS TEAM PASTA DINNER & SILENT AUCTION






